# Paddleboard Purchase With JCF Grant

Jasper County Conservation Board received \$8,000 from the Jasper Community Foundation (JCF) to purchase ten stand-up paddleboards to use in our public programming. Paddleboarding has become a popular sport and JCCB staff members are excited to offer this option at our events.

Prior to this, paddleboards had been borrowed from Warren County Conservation and usage was limited to one week in the summer. Now paddleboarding and kayaking will be offered at all of our public paddles and the watersports summer camps.

Paddleboards were purchased through Crawdaddy Outdoors in Waverly, Iowa. JCCB is purchasing a trailer to haul the equipment.

Each of the 10 geocaches will have a different wildlife card to collect. If you collect all 10 by the end of the year and turn them into the conservation office, you will receive a fun JCCB prize!

If you do not already have GPS on your mobile device, we recommend downloading the free Geocaching app. Geocaches will remain in the parks for the year so you'll have plenty of time to locate them all.

# Community Garden Space Available

Have you ever wanted to try out your green thumb but haven't had the room to do it? A summer of growing fresh produce to enjoy is easier than you may think!

Thirteen raised beds are available to reserve at the Community Garden, located in Newton east of the Centre for Arts and Artists. A double-sided composting bin is available for use, along with a rain barrel for watering plants. Growers are responsible for weeding and maintaining their raised beds. Produce is reserved to the person(s) maintaining the plot unless that person has given permission to another grower to take produce from their plot. A produce stand will be at the garden site for those who wish to share their extra produce.

Jasper County Conservation is currently taking reservations for raised bed plots. Plots are free and open to all community members. To reserve a garden bed, call JCCB at (641) 792-9780 or email jread@jasperia.org.

# Summer Camp Registration

Payment and waivers are due within 14 days of signing up or the child will lose their spot. If a child fails to attend the camp they signed up for, their registration fee will be considered a donation to Jasper County Conservation.

## National Wetlands Month

### Celebration

#### Saturday, May 7, 8:00 AM-2:00 PM Various Locations in Jasper County

May is National Wetlands Month and JCCB would like to invite the public to a full day of events. From 8:00-10:00 AM there will be guided birding hikes taking place all over the county, including Jacob Krumm Nature Preserve, Mariposa Park, Neal Smith Wildlife Refuge, and Ashton Wildwood Park. A bird banding demonstration will be at the home of licensed bird banders Bob and Connie Van Ersvelde south of Grinnell.

Starting at 11:00 AM, there will be a Wetland Restoration Projects presentation at the Newton Izaak Walton League by Eric Imerman with the Jasper County Soil and Water Conservation District.

At 11:45 AM, wildlife photographer Kip Ladage will share his photos taken at Sweet Marsh Wildlife Area in northeast Iowa, and at 12:15 PM JCCB Naturalist Greg Oldsen will talk about his floating wetlands project. Afterwards, volunteers can help plant a floating wetland that will be placed at the Izaak Walton League's pond and participate in an aquatic invertebrate study (pondnetting) from 1:00-2:00 PM.


## Public Lake Paddles
