

For the 9/1/22 to 8/31/23 paid claims period, claims were \$6,108 lower than the prior claims period which translates to a renewal decrease. There are many components to the renewal calculation, including Wellmark re-adjusting the base cost differences between all their plans, which means our traditional plan will have a 2.3% and the HDHP .70% decreases.

There will be a new Specialty prescription Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM) named PrudentRx. The copay for specialty prescriptions will be \$0 copay. There are 5 members who currently take specialty medications and they will be contacted directly by PrudentRx.

Lastly, Wellmark has retired the BlueChoice product name and replaced it with Blue POS (Point-of-Service). The new plan's features and functionality will be the same as the old plan.

The IRS has again made an inflationary adjustment to the HDHP family minimum out-of-pocket from \$3,000 to \$3,200 (For embedded plans). However, the second family member will only have a \$2,400 out-of-pocket maximum so that the total family out-of-pocket will remain at \$5,600.

Delta Dental will increase rates by 3%. Principal will reduce vision benefit rates by 11% and Voluntary Term Life rates remain unchanged.

Again, Principal is offering a re-opening for the Voluntary Term Life up to 2 units each per employee, spouse, and child(ren) without a statement of health. This includes all current and future first-time enrollees. Spouse and children life coverage amounts cannot exceed the employee coverage amount.

The County's medical plan contribution for plan #3 coverage will be 90% of the monthly rates. Employees will contribute 10% for single and family coverage. The County monthly contribution will be \$823 92 for single contracts and \$1,834.78 for family coverage.

Open enrollment for completing paperwork will begin October 30 with forms to be returned by November 6. The Federal ERISA and IRC Section 125 codes require employees to annually designate their plan choice and either elect or waive participation in the pre-tax and/or flexible spending account.

Some items to remember: A Flexible Spending Account (IRC 125) election can only be changed during the year for a qualifying event (e.g. Birth, Death, Divorce, and Marriage). The Principal vision plan does not have a calendar year deductible or co-insurance and therefore benefits are based upon the last date-of-service. If a member terminates the dental plan and later wishes to re-enroll, they will be subject to one and 2-year deferred benefits for Basic and Major Services. Dependent children will have a 3-year deferred benefit for Orthodontics.

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The County's medical plan contribution for plan #3 coverage will be 90% of the monthly rates. Employees will contribute 10% for single and family coverage. The County monthly contribution will be \$673.92 for single contracts and \$1,684.78 for family coverage.

Open enrollment for completing paperwork will begin October 30 with forms to be returned by November 6. The Federal ERISA and IRC Section 125 codes require employees to annually designate their plan choice and either elect or waive participation in the pre-tax and/or flexible spending account.

Some items to remember: A Flexible Spending Account (IRC 125) election can only be changed during the year for a qualifying event (e.g. Birth, Death, Divorce, and Marriage). The Principal vision plan does not have a calendar year deductible or co-insurance and therefore benefits are based upon the last date-of-service. If a member terminates the dental plan and later wishes to re-enroll, they will be subject to one and 2-year deferred benefits for Basic and Major Services. Dependent children will have a 3-year deferred benefit for Orthodontics.



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# CHAPTER 28E AGREEMENT BETWEEN GOVERNMENT ENTITIES IN JASPER COUNTY, IOWA AND JASPER COUNTY FOR THE JASPER COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROVIDING ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT SERVICES IN JASPER COUNTY

This Agreement is made and entered into as of this \_\_\_\_\_ day of Aug\_, 2023, by and between the Iowa Cities of Baxter, Collins, Gilman, Grinnell, Kellogg, Mitchellville, Prairie City, Reasnor, Sully, Colfax, (the "service providers" or "service provider") and Jasper County.

WHEREAS, the parties recognize the lack of Advanced Life Support (ALS) services throughout Jasper County and surrounding rural areas; and,

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that the Jasper County Sheriff's Office has implemented an Emergency Medical Services Program that includes ALS services and it is in the best interest of the undersigned government entities to enter into this Agreement to provide stability in access to ALS services to members of Jasper County and surrounding rural areas; and

WHEREAS, the parties further acknowledge that it is in the best interest of the undersigned service providers to provide assistance and support for the operation of such ALS services when the Jasper County Sherriff's Office ALS provider takes over primary care of a patient.

THEREFORE, in accord with Chapter 28E and other relevant sections of the Code of Iowa, the service providers enter into the following agreement regarding ALS services within Jasper County.

#### **SECTION 1 - PURPOSE**

Under this Agreement, the Jasper County Sheriff's Office will provide Advanced Life Support services to the undersigned primary service providers on an as needed basis to increase ALS access to individuals throughout Jasper County and the surrounding areas.

#### **SECTION 2 – DEFINITIONS**

2.1 "Advanced Life Support" – Life support techniques that are performed by paramedic apart from such services that are performed by an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), as authorized by the Iowa Emergency Medical Care Provider Scope of Practice.

"Basic Life Support" – Life support techniques that are authorized to be performed by an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) under the Iowa Emergency Medical Care Provider Scope of Practice.

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"Service Providers" — The Emergency Medical Service provider from a governmental entity.

#### SECTION 3 – OBLIGATIONS OF PARTIES

- 3.1 <u>Obligations of Jasper County to Each Participating Service Provider:</u> Jasper County shall be at all times obligated to the other parties to this Agreement to provide ALS services when available and when required or requested by a participating service provider.
