Jasper County Resource Guide - October 27, 2023

Neapolitan Labs will work with the Jasper County Health Department to create an interactive version of the PDF-based Health & Human Services Resource Guide. The online guide will be easy to search and filter for website visitors. Updates can be made on-demand via the Mint Chip Lab platform that powers the overall county site.

Background

Neapolitan Labs worked with Jasper County to launch a new website in October 2023. The Health Department page includes a link to the Jasper County Health & Human Resources Guide, a 60-page PDF document that includes categorized listings of resident resources and services covering topics from childcare to mental health to veteran services.

User Experience

The fully interactive Resource Guide will be part of the new Jasper County website, accessible via the Health Department section and the website's overall search. The guide will be mobile-optimized and easy for visitors to search.

Directory Search

In addition to perusing a landing page that lists all available resources, visitors will be able to search by keyword or organization name, or filter by Category.

Connect with community resources by searching by keyword, county, or category.

Short Links

If desired, a user-friendly short URL can be established to make the guide easy for the public to access, like <u>jasperia.org/resources</u>. Additionally, each resource category could have an additional direct URL for sharing via email or on social media, e.g. <u>jasperia.org/resources/assistance</u>.

Print-Friendly Design

All entries in the Resource Guide will be built to be print-friendly with header, footer, and navigation elements hidden. Users could print information about individual resources, a list of resources in a category, or the entire resource guide, potentially eliminating the need for a standalone PDF guide.

Updates

Jasper County Health Department employees will have direct access to add, update, or delete resources within the guide via Mint Chip Lab. The back-end view includes an instant search feature at the top to quickly find a resource to make edits.

A Draft status will be available to hide a listing from the website but keep an internal record in case the business or organization resumes offering services in the future.

User-Submitted Updates

A form will be added to the website for resource changes to be submitted to the Health Department to review and consider implementing on the website. These changes could be submitted by contacts from the listed organizations or members of the public who could be aware of changes to hours, contact information, or the availability of services.

Category Management

If a new category is needed in the future, or one needs to be removed, the Jasper County Health Department will be able to make these updates via Mint Chip Lab and have them instantly reflected on the website. Additionally, a photo and/or introduction message can be associated with each resource category. This would provide a spot for the shorter bullet-point listings that are part of the Food section within the current guide.

Content Import

Neapolitan Labs will import all content from the PDF-based Resource Guide to minimize time requirements for the Health Department. County employees will be given a private URL to review the guide before it is released to the public.

Disclaimer

The current guide's disclaimer will be part of the interactive Resource Guide and also be shown on all printed pages. Printouts will have the date printed as a reference point along with the guide's URL to view the latest information.

Training

Training will be provided to ensure the Health Department (and/or Jasper County IT) has the proper access and instructions to maintain and update the guide. All management will be done via the Mint Chip Lab platform, used to manage the new overall county website.

Timeframe

With approval, Neapolitan Labs will immediately begin developing the new features and importing resource listings. A preview is expected to be available for review within 4-6 weeks of proposal acceptance with launch and training shortly after.

Costs

One-Time Development: \$6,000

The cost for the development, content import, and training outlined in this proposal is \$6,000, with half of the project invoiced at project commencement and the final invoice sent following project completion. There are no recurring or annual costs to support the resource guide as it will be part of the overall county website.

- 1. PARTIES AND SCOPE OF WORK: Allender Butzke Engineers (hereinafter referred to as "ABE") shall perform the work as set forth in ABE's proposal, the client's acceptance thereof if accepted by ABE and these General Conditions. "Client" refers to the person or business entity ordering the work to be done by ABE. If the client is ordering the work on behalf of another, the client represents and warrants that the client is the duly authorized agent of said party for the purpose of ordering and directing said work. Unless otherwise stated in writing, the client assumes sole responsibility for determining whether the quantity and the nature of the work ordered by the client is adequate and sufficient for the client's intended purpose. Client shall communicate these General Conditions to each and every third party to whom the client transmits any part of ABE's work. ABE shall have no duty or obligation to any third party greater than that set forth in ABE's proposal, client's acceptance thereof and these General Conditions. ABE may issue a third party reliance letter to a party the client identifies in writing provided ABE solely determines that the report is still reliable and that the third party, it's successors, assigns, and agents agree in writing to these General Conditions and agree to pay ABE the greater of either 10 percent of the contract amount or \$250.00 for issuing the reliance letter. - 2.
