



Measles in the United States

FEBRUARY 14, 2024

Between December 1, 2023 and January 23, 2024, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) was notified of 23 confirmed U.S. cases of measles, including seven direct importations of measles by international travelers and two outbreaks with more than five cases each. Most of these cases were among children and adolescents who had not received a measles-containing vaccine (MMR or MMRV), even if age eligible. Of the cases reported from December 1 until January 23, nine have been reported since the beginning of the year from Georgia, Missouri, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. No cases of measles have been identified in lowa since 2019.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

Due to the recent cases reported in the United States, Iowa HHS is recommending healthcare providers in Iowa be alert for suspect measles cases. Measles is characterized by a prodrome of fever (may spike to more than 104°F), cough, coryza, and conjunctivitis (the three "C"s), followed by a maculopapular rash that spreads from the head to the trunk to the lower extremities. Healthcare providers should consider measles in patients presenting with febrile rash illness and clinically compatible measles symptoms, especially if the person recently traveled internationally, or was exposed to a person with febrile rash illness.

If you have a patient who is suspected of having measles

- 1. Isolate: Do not allow patients with suspected measles to remain in the waiting room or other common areas of the healthcare facility; isolate patients with suspected measles immediately, ideally in a single-patient airborne infection isolation room (AIIR) if available, or in a private room with a closed door until an AIIR is available. Healthcare providers should have presumptive evidence of immunity to measles and should adhere to standard and airborne precautions including a fit tested N95 or equivalent when evaluating suspect cases regardless of their vaccination status.
- 2. **Notify:** Immediately notify CADE while the patient is still at the health care facility by calling 515-242-5935 during business hours or 515-323-4360 after hours about any suspected case of measles. CADE will facilitate testing and provide additional guidance.
- 3. **Test:** Iowa HHS epidemiologists will work with healthcare providers to guide appropriate specimen collection for testing at the State Hygienic Laboratory. Patients should remain at home and away from others as much as possible until results are received to guide further public health recommendations.

How to prevent measles

 Assess your patients vaccination status and promote measles-containing vaccines (MMR or MMRV) for patients who do not have <u>presumptive evidence of immunity</u>.

Cases of measles are immediately reportable to Iowa HHS and can be reported by phone 24/7 at 515-242-5935 during business hours or 515-323-4360 after hours. More information about measles can be found on the Iowa HHS website.
