- Renovations – 1985, 2000, 2008, 2012, 2013

5. CAPITAL ENDOWMENT GIFT - 2015

- Brad and Mary Manatt \$5M for capital

6. FACILITY OWNERSHIP - 2016

- Trustees of Newton Community Center, Inc. dissolve and forward ownership to the YMCA
- Last major renovations takes place.

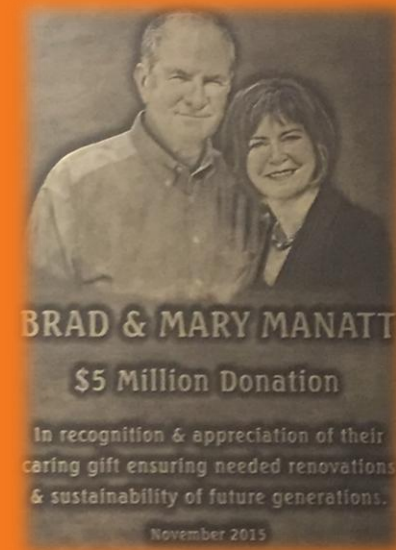
COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Expanding the facility will enrich existing fitness programs, develop a youth-focused center, and offer new amenities for individuals and families.

The expansion will include updating and expanding the weight room, adding recreational sports and gym space, and creating a teen center.

The new teen center will house youth development and offer a much-needed safe space for teens to meet and connect with one another. New sports and additional gym space, including a tennis/pickleball court, will alleviate programming issues and offer a variety of programs to attract a diverse group of members. The facility will accommodate additional locker rooms, office space, and fitness studios to serve our growing membership.

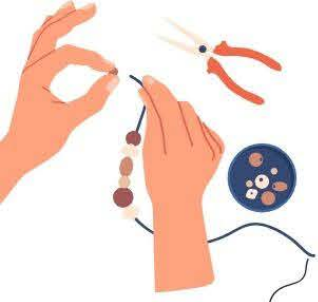

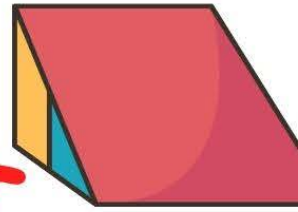

Behavioral Health System Navigation

System Navigation is a non-crisis, but time-sensitive response service that helps individuals and those supporting them — their family members, caregivers, professionals, and community members — understand, access, and connect with behavioral health supports and services across Iowa.

Behavioral Health System Navigation does not provide clinical assessment, treatment, medication prescriptions or counseling services. Instead, it helps people better understand their options and get connected to what they need.

Support is provided by System Navigators – trained and experienced peer support specialists, community health workers and behavioral health professionals. They bridge barriers to care by connecting community partners, health care professionals and the individuals they serve with:

- Confidential support.
- Information and education.
- Referrals to mental health and substance use providers.
- Assistance in finding psychiatric beds, if needed.

Who can benefit from System Navigation services?

- **Individuals who seek services for themselves.**
- **Partnering providers**, such as disability access points (DAPs), social workers, law enforcement, correctional facilities, health care providers, crisis service workers, educators and schools, and others who seek assistance for people they serve.
- **Family members, caregivers, or friends** who seek services for a loved one. *(Adults or guardians must request this service on behalf of a child or adolescent.)*

Behavioral Health System Navigation connects Iowans to services that address:

- Mental health concerns.
- Substance use disorders and recovery services.
- Gambling concerns.
- Addictive disorders

System Navigation addresses financial, housing, social or employment concerns. The service also ensures access to support for rural Iowans and populations with limited access to healthcare.

Who is eligible and how much does it cost?

System Navigation services are **free of charge**. There are no insurance requirements.

Starting July 1, Community Partners can contact System Navigators directly. Call (515) 505-8988.

How do Community Partners and Providers access Behavioral Health System Navigation?

Starting July 1, Community Partners and Providers can call (515) 505-8988 to coordinate directly with Iowa Primary Care Association's Behavioral Health System Navigators.

Iowans seeking assistance can call Your Life Iowa at 855-581-8111.

Iowans seeking assistance will be connected with a System Navigator via warm hand-off during business hours.

Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

All calls will be returned within 24 business hours.

All callers will be connected with a System Navigator within one business day. *Immediate crises or medical emergencies should be directed to 911 or 988 (the National Suicide Prevention & Crisis Lifeline).*

Community Partners and/or the people they serve can meet with a System Navigator via a phone call or through online support. *Community Partners will be notified when in-person System Navigation services are available.*

The System Navigator will help all participants explore options and overcome barriers to care. They can also help find beds for individuals who need inpatient psychiatric care or community-based crisis care.

Throughout the process, the System Navigator will offer support and connection, providing “warm hand-offs” to providers and services.

You may continue to reach out to your System Navigator as needed, and they will follow up to ensure individuals received the support they needed.

Jasper County Tobacco Community Partnership Overview

FY2025

This project is funded by the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services. Services provided by this grant are based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Best Practices for Tobacco Prevention and Control. Highlighted below is the work that took place in FY2025 by American Lung Association staff.

Youth Tobacco Prevention

- **17 schools received tobacco prevention resources**
- **2 schools provided training and technical assistance**

Youth tobacco prevention work involves educating youth and adults, providing cessation and educational resources to schools and youth-focused organizations and establishing and supporting youth tobacco prevention groups. Community engagement presentations are focused on educating adults on tobacco and nicotine products, youth trends and resources. Higher success was found in schools among nurses, counselors and other support staff. Finally, staff worked to establish ISTEP (Iowa Students for Tobacco Education & Prevention) chapters within schools and youth groups. Staff have been able to provide financial and technical assistance to students to support the education and prevention activities each chapter does in their community. Facilitator time and commitment continue to be a barrier.

Tobacco and Nicotine-free Policy

- **0 organizations implemented comprehensive policies**
- **34 organizations were provided resources and technical assistance for policy**

Tobacco and Nicotine-free policies help protect people from secondhand and thirdhand smoke and help people quit. Through this grant, organizations receive support to implement and/or enforce a policy that is comprehensive, applies to the entire property and all tobacco products. High success was found in childcare centers and homes with low response rates noted in overall businesses. A common reason for low interest includes belief that no current problem exists; therefore, a policy is not necessary. Tobacco policy can improve public health, create a safer environment and reduce overall healthcare costs.

Jasper County Tobacco Community Partnership Overview

FY2025

Quitline Iowa

- 34 program users
- 8 organizations received Quitline Iowa resources and materials

Quitline Iowa is a free resource for all Iowans to help them recover from tobacco. Through this program, providers are able to refer patients to Quitline Iowa. Lung Association staff were able to meet with healthcare providers to increase referrals and utilization of Quitline Iowa. Highest success was found with community-based organizations with lower success in the specialized health care like dental, vision and wellness.
