CONSTRUCTION EVALUATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors wishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2026 and January 31, 2027 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF JASPER COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

Update Section III, B with the following information:

B. TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY AND RIGHT-OF-WAY VERIFICATION

PROFESSIONAL shall provide a topographic survey within the new grading and paving for the curve along Highway F48W at W 124th Street S (Curve I) and around each of the nine (9) culverts requiring guardrail system design.

PROFESSIONAL shall perform additional topographic survey and right-ofway verification along W 124th Street S and S 44th Avenue W for improvements of the curve geometry along W 124th Street S.



Update Section III, F with the following information:

F. ROADWAY DESIGN AND PLAN PREPARATION

- 11. PROFESSIONAL shall perform additional design and plan preparation services for improvements to the curve along W 124th Street S and at the intersection with S 44th Avenue W east of Curve 1. This includes geometric layout, profile design, ROW design, roadway modeling, intersection design, culvert replacement, quantities, and plan tabulations.
- 12. PROFESSIONAL shall coordinate with COUNTY, Iowa DOT Local System Bureau, Iowa DOT Rail Bureau, and Iowa Interstate Railroad (IAIS) on railroad crossings in proximity to the project. This includes onsite field diagnostics meetings, meeting notes, cost estimate on concepted improvements to the IAIS rail crossing, and adjustment of design and plans to account for the removal of the IAIS rail crossing.

Revise Section V, F with the following information:

F. EASEMENT AND ACQUISITION PLATTING

The PROFESSIONAL shall perform platting of easement and acquisitions as noted below.

- 1. Acquisition Plats:
 - a. PROFESSIONAL will provide plats in accordance with the Iowa Code.
 - b. This service includes:
 - i. Research public records in the County courthouse and acquire the current recorded deed(s), subdivision plat(s), recorded survey(s), and section corner certificate(s).
 - ii. Reestablish section corners and determine the section lines.
 - iii. Perform a field survey locating existing monuments and the best available evidence needed to re-establish needed record boundary lines.
 - iv. Set monuments at the corners of the acquisition areas indicated on the drawing.
 - v. A certified drawing at a suitable scale depicting the need(s) of the acquisition will be delivered upon completion.
 - c. All plats will be provided to the COUNTY for the recording of the drawing at the county recorder's office.
 - d. It is estimated that four (4) acquisition plats will be prepared.
- 2. Right-of-Way Vacation Plat
 - a. PROFESSIONAL will provide plats in accordance with the Iowa Code for the process of vacating excess right-of-way for future conveyance.



- b. PROFESSIONAL will prepare and provide a certified drawing(s) with a suitable scale depicting the results of the survey.
- c. It is understood that the COUNTY will coordinate with the County Attorney on additional legal documents required in the recording of the Vacation Plat.
- d. It is estimated that four (4) right-of-way vacation plats will be prepared.

3. Permanent Easement Plats and Temporary Construction Easement Exhibit and Descriptions

The PROFESSIONAL will provide two (2) Temporary Construction Easement Exhibits, two (2) Permanent Easement Plats, and Legal Descriptions in accordance with the Iowa Code. This service includes a drawing at a suitable scale depicting the need(s) of the Temporary Easement Exhibit or Permanent Easement Plat and will be delivered upon completion. The CLIENT is encouraged to seek the advice of an attorney to determine what, if any, additional documents may be needed to establish the easement and to establish the rights and responsibilities of said easement. All Temporary Construction Easement Exhibits or Permanent Easement Plats will be provided to the CLIENT for the recording of the easement exhibit at the County recorder's office, if required.

Add Section III. H with the following information:

G. CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION

Upon award of the construction contract, the PROFESSIONAL will perform the following construction administration and consultation services during the construction of the project. It is understood that the COUNTY will perform the construction engineering on the project which includes day-to-day coordination and construction administration, construction observation, material testing, and verification. These extra services can be added to the Agreement, if requested by the COUNTY, under a separate Supplemental Agreement.

- i. The PROFESSIONAL will attend a preconstruction meeting with the COUNTY, the awarded Contractor, utility companies, and Iowa DOT to review project requirements and construction schedule. The PROFESSIONAL will prepare the minutes for the preconstruction meeting and forward them to the COUNTY. The COUNTY will arrange, coordinate, and conduct the preconstruction meeting.
- ii. The PROFESSIONAL will be available for site visits as requested by the COUNTY. It is estimated that four (4) site visits will be made for the construction of this project.
- iii. The PROFESSIONAL will be available to answer design interpretation questions from the COUNTY, Contractor, Iowa DOT, or other review agencies.



- iv. The PROFESSIONAL will be available for one (1) site visit, as requested by the COUNTY to sound and identify limits of culvert repairs.
- v. These services do not include submittal reviews, payment application preparation, change order preparation, substantial completion determination, final walk-through, DocExpress documentation, payroll certification review, material certification review, plant reports, stormwater site inspections, Iowa DOT reimbursement requests, Iowa DOT audit coordination, etc.

Tuesday, December 16, 2025, the Jasper County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:30 a.m. with Supervisors Talsma, Cupples, and Nearmyer present and accounted for Chairman Talsma presiding.

Motion by Nearmyer, seconded by Cupples to set a Public Hearing date for a County owned property sale for parcel # 08.32.201.007 with a recommended date and time of January 6th, 2025, at 9:30 a.m. in the Jasper County Board of Supervisors Room.

YEA: NEARMYER, CUPPLES, TALSMA

Colfax Economic Development Co presented to the Board on the new Colfax Daycare Center. There is currently a shortage of childcare and CEDCO recognized the demand. CEDCO applied for a grant and was awarded \$1.7 million as a 1 to 1 match. The current short fall in funding is \$900,000 and they are asking for \$500,000 paid over several years. The Board will take some time to think about the formal request. No action was taken.

Maintenance Director, Adam Sparks received quotes for moving an a/c unit from the roof of the Jasper County Sheriff's Office to the basement. There was a total of 2 quotes presented:

Veterans Affairs Director, Ray Maxey spoke with the Board on possibly using an open office at the Administration Building for the Veteran Center Counselor's visits 2 times per month to allow for more of a personal setting. The Board discussed the quote for the Sheriff's Office training center that is coming back at \$588,000. The Board borrowed roughly \$500,000 in July 2025 to complete this project. Due to there being a shortfall between the two amounts the Board would be fine with moving forward with the current quote and using LOST funds to help cover the difference. Sheriff Shutts spoke with the Board regarding the renewal of an Axon Contract. The quote consisted of a 10-year contract vs. 5-year contract and bundling the packages together for additional cost savings. A budget timeline was discussed for FY26-27. The Board would also like to move forward with placing language on the General Election ballot to implement a hotel/motel tax for the County.
